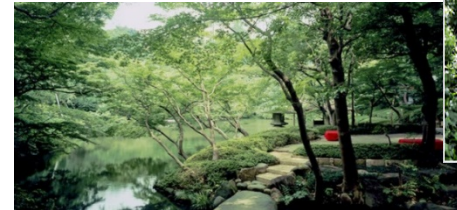
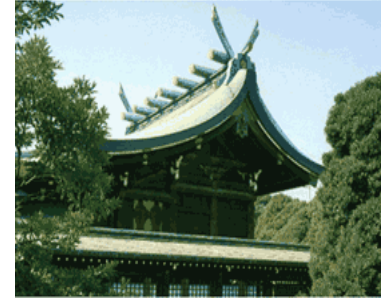
Tokyo Skytree is a new television broadcasting tower and landmark of Tokyo which is 634m high . It was recognized by the Guinness World Records Company in 2011. The visit to skytree will offer unparalleled views of the city.



The oldest and most famous temple in Tokyo (Sensoji temple) is located in Asakusa. Nakamise, with 100 little shops on both sides of the street, is the best place to get Japanese souvenirs.



Meiji Jingu is a Shinto (Japan's ancient original religion) shrine established in 1920 as the people wished to commemorate the virtues of Emperor Meiji and Empress Shoken, and to venerate them forever. It values harmony with nature and virtues such as "Magokoro (sincere heart)"



Happo-en, whose name (meaning the garden of eight views) reflects its beauty viewed from any angle, is a magnificent garden that has maintained the natural beauty of Edo Japan down through the centuries and bequeathed it to present-day Tokyo. It makes tasteful use of a hillside (with stream running through it) covering a vast 50,000 square meter area in Tokyo's fashionable Shirokanedai district.
